"Give Thanks this Thanksgiving and Every Day"

urkeys seasoned, stuffing hot from the oven. Creamed onions, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pie. Family members jointing in on the great Thanksgiving feast in our homes. Children waiting for the Great Pumpkin to rise over Charlie Brown's pumpkin patch and dads watching Dallas Cowboys football. A day to relax and maybe rake leaves in the afternoon? (I don't think so!)

But Thanksgiving? How much will our family Thanksgiving celebrations have to do with giving thanks?

A glance at the first Thanksgiving brings it all back. On December 21, 1620 the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock. Through the dead of winter the colony struggled with poor and meager food, strenuous labor, a biting wind that chilled to the bone, and the ravages of disease. Nearly half the 102 Mayflower passengers did not live to see spring refresh Cape Cod Bay.

But God sent some Native Americans -- Samoset, Squanto, and Massasoit -- to help the English settlers plant and hunt and fish. The bountiful harvest that autumn led Governor Bradford to invite the Indians to celebrate God's goodness. Ninety tall braves accepted the invitation to join the Pilgrims in a feast of Thanksgiving to God for His blessings.

The Pilgrims lived close enough to the soil to know how dependent they were on God's Providence. They had learned to thank God in the midst of the bitterness of winter past. And they were quick to thank Him during abundant blessing, too.

We teach our children to say "please" and "thank you" as the rudiments of courtesy, yet it is so easy to be rude and unthinking toward God. How often we forget to gratefully acknowledge His goodness towards us.

This Thanksgiving let your prayers and expressions of love rise toward your Heavenly Father.

Yes, we still need pledges for \$200,000 for 2025, but it's obvious to me that we can do it and that we will do it!! Thank you ALL so very much! Trinity has been a church since 1879, and I have been a member since1978; so I would be sooo sad to see it close.

I am also thankful to all of you who have volunteered to do jobs around our church when you see a need, knowing that you wouldn't be paid financially but would be paid in the knowledge that YOU helped get things done, save our church some money, and have given us all hope for the future of Trinity!

At this Thanksgiving, let's pay attention to needs in our community, our country, and in countries around the world. So many have so much less than we do. If you have a place to call "home," you have much more than so many. If you can fill your fridge every week, you are doing better than many. If your home has A/C and heat, you are doing better than many. Let's be sure to thank God and anyone who pays bills for all this. If you are the one paying the bills, be thankful that you are able to work (or were before retirement).

Please remember to be grateful for all you have. So many do not have all (or any) of this! "Give thanks with a <u>grateful</u> heart!"



Digital 3D Mobile Mammograms are **coming your way**!

To have a mammogram on our Mobile Mammography Unit, you must:

- Be 40 years of age or older (insurance permitting).
 Under 40 years of age must have a physicians order for screening.
- · Have not had a mammogram within the past 365 days.
- Last mammogram must have been negative.
- Have NO NEW symptoms, such as lumps, pain, skin changes, or nipple discharge. (See a physician right away if you have changes.Call us if you do not have a physician.)
- · Have not had breast cancer in the last three years.

Be prepared for your visit:

- · Bring the name, address, and phone number of your physician.
- If you have had a mammogram in the past, locate your films and bring them to your mammography appointment. If you are unable to do so, bring the location name and phone number of where you received the previous mammogram.
- · Bring a valid photo ID.
- Bring your insurance card (we accept Medicare, Medicaid, and most private insurances).*
- DO NOT wear deodorant, perfume, powders, or lotions.
- DO wear a two-piece outfit.

A physician's order is NOT needed for patients who have seen their physician within a year prior to their mammogram appointment.

* If you do not have insurance or a doctor, please call 210.703.8100 for details and to learn how you can get a mammogram through the generosity of community funding.

The Trinity UMC pumpkin patch was a **great success**! So many families and neighbors came to play games and wander through the pumpkins. Countless numbers came to take pictures- from a new born- to a woman with her aging father. The **simple act of sitting among the pumpkins brought smiles and joy!** People who did not know anything about Trinity UMC **now know we are friendly** and engaging. Parents brought their little ones to play the games, get prizes and have a little free fun in the afternoon! The Trunk-or-Treat and the Farmers Market allowed us to partner with A2Z Day Care and the vendors.

These pumpkins were grown on Navajo Land near Farmington, New Mexico. They were unloaded by high school and middle school students from Warren High School, Sotomayor High School, and Hobby and Pat Neff Middle Schools. They were sold to church members, friends and neighbors from across San Antonio. The remaining pumpkins will go to feed cattle, deer and other creatures. Our reach is wide- our work is a blessing.

Thank you to all who helped with the delivery of the 700+ pumpkins and the planning and set up of the patch. Also, **thank you to those who purchased pumpkins and told their friends and family** to stop by. And a great big thank you to all who spent hours manning the sales area of the pumpkin patch. The final numbers are not in, but we sold over \$2400! Trinity will keep 25% of the total sales. But the results are more than the money. We have met people, blessed them, and shared God's grace upon this corner of our community. **Well done!**
